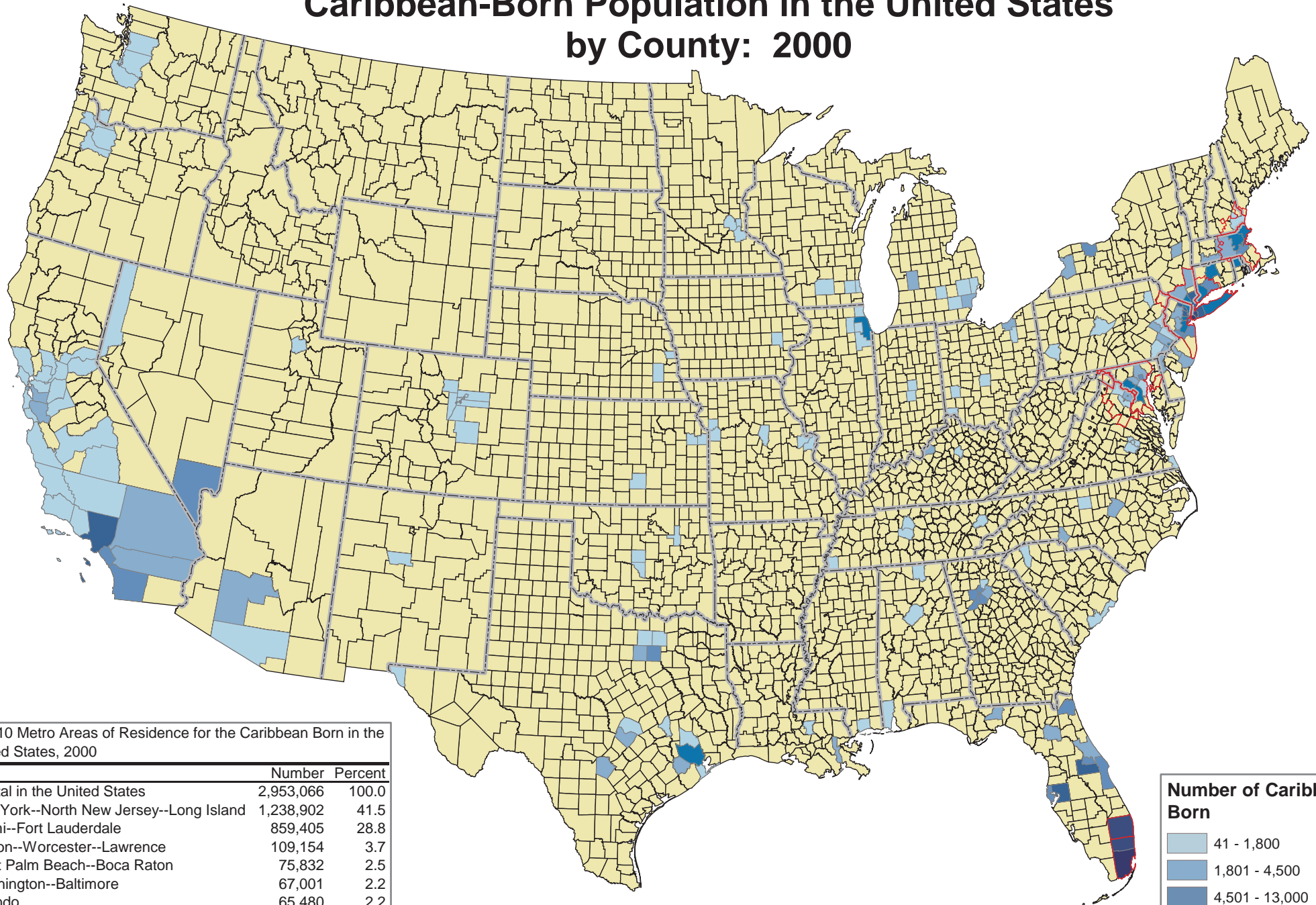
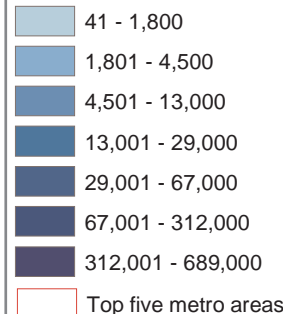


# Caribbean-Born Population in the United States by County: 2000

Note: Metro areas are classified as Consolidated Metropolitan Statistical Areas (CMSA), except for West Palm Beach--Boca Raton, Orlando, Tampa--St. Petersburg--Clearwater, and Atlanta, which are classified as Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA).

In 2000, there were 2,953,066 Caribbean-born individuals living in the United States.

The states with the largest Caribbean-born population were Florida (1,105,079), New York (1,004,344), and New Jersey (238,572).

Two in every five of the Caribbean born lived in the New York metropolitan area.
