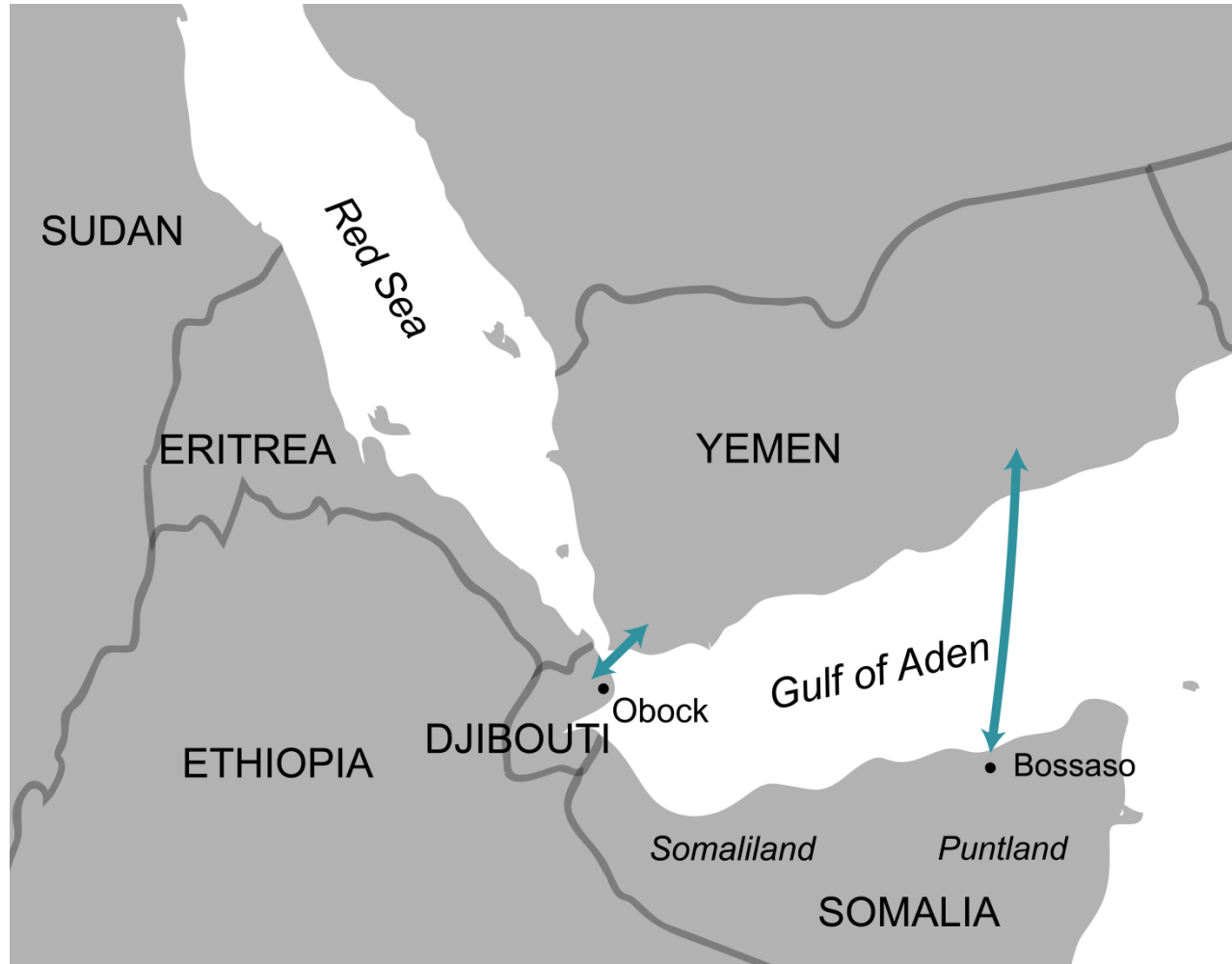
Maritime Migration Routes to Europe

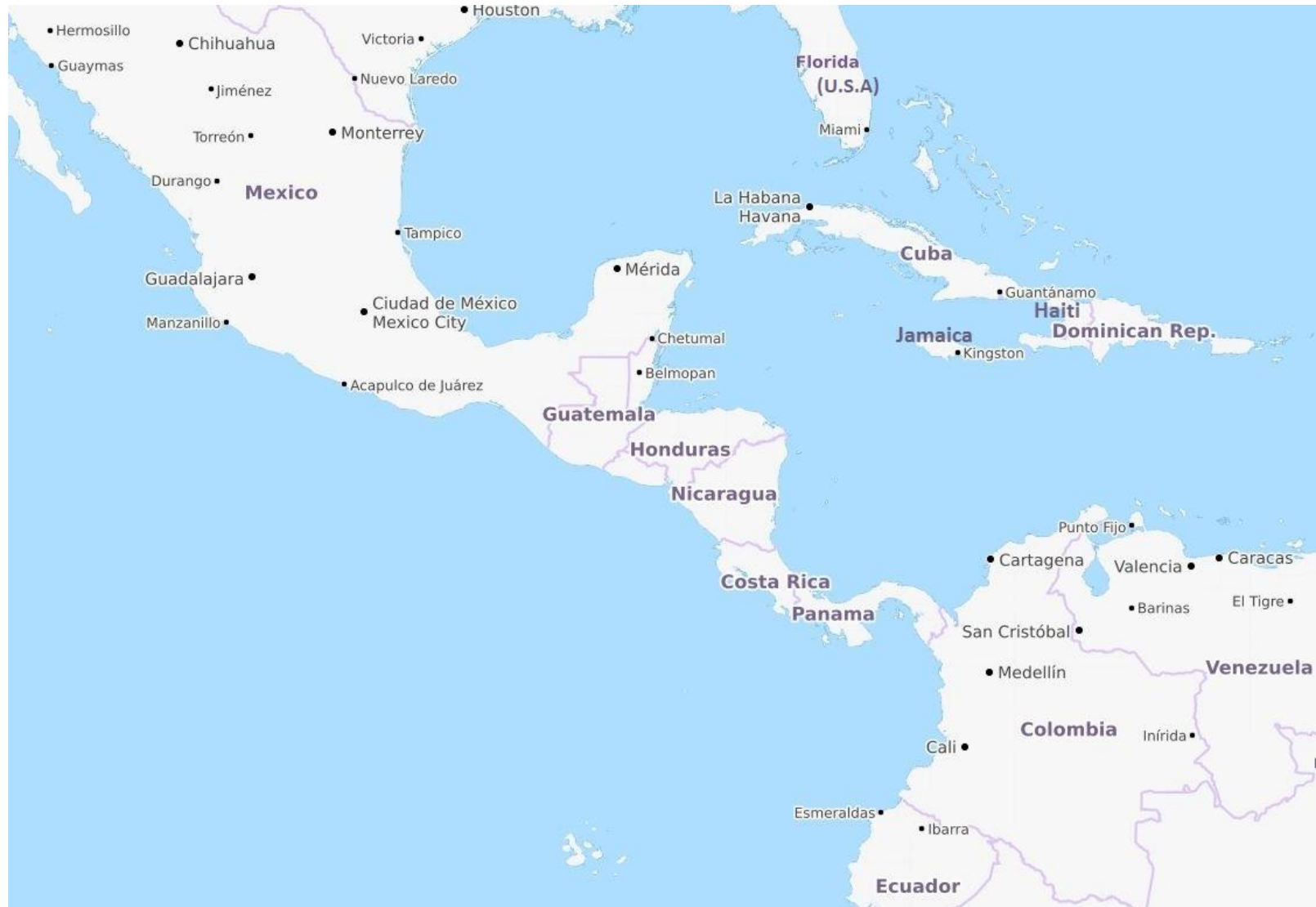
Maritime Migration between the Horn of Africa and Yemen
